



Student Bursary Program

Purpose

The objective of the First Nations Tax Commission (“FNTC”) Education program is to promote an understanding of the real property taxation systems of First Nations in Canada, develop training programs for First Nation real property tax administrators, and to build capacity in First Nations to administer their taxation system. The FNTC has developed a partnership with the Tulo Centre of Indigenous Economics (“TULO”) and Thompson Rivers University (“TRU”) to provide students with an accredited education program that results in an understanding of how to provide administrative and legal certainty as well as quality infrastructure to facilitate investment on First Nations lands. The FNTC has developed a student bursary program to provide financial support to property tax administrators working in First Nations in Canada to attend courses in property tax administration and First Nation economics.

Policy

The FNTC administers and manages the student bursary program in a fair and equitable manner.

The maximum bursary available to a student will cover tuition, a portion of travel, accommodation, and meal cards (when applicable) to attend a qualifying course/program.

Courses qualifying for the FNTC bursary program include those offered through Tulo only.

The availability of student bursaries is determined by the FNTC on an annual basis and may be changed by the FNTC without notice.

Schedule, course, content, tuition, travel, meal and accommodation rates are subject to change without notice.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants are required to provide the following information in order to be eligible to receive a FNTC student Bursary:

- Proof of employment with a First Nation in Canada in the property tax administration area
- A demonstrated involvement in the area of First Nation property tax administration and in professional development
- Completed application form
- Proof of attendance and achievement of a passing grade on previous FNTC bursary programs

The applicant agrees to the following:

- To abide by the terms and conditions of the FNTC Student Bursary Program including the attendance and cancellation policies.



- To allow Tulo Center of Indigenous Economics to release the following bursary recipient information to the FNTC: name, first nation employer, attendance records, and grade achieved.
- To abide by the rules and policies as set out by the Tulo Centre of Indigenous Economics Program Handbook.
- To notify the FNTC immediately if unable to attend a course they are registered for under the student bursary program.

Selection Process

Student bursary applications will be reviewed and assessed by the FNTC on a first come basis and will be subject to available funding. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Bursary Payment

Bursaries for tuition fees and meal cards will be paid directly to the educational institution on behalf of the student.

Travel arrangements for airfare and hotel accommodation will be arranged and paid directly by the FNTC on behalf of the student. The FNTC will select hotel accommodations for all student Bursary programs. Alternate travel and accommodation arrangements made by a student will not be reimbursed by the FNTC.

Amounts to reimburse for vehicle transportation will be paid directly to the First Nation employer.

Attendance Policy

FNTC recognizes the importance of attendance and participation to the learning process. Attendance is required for all classes. Students are required to stay for the duration of all classes. Absenteeism may result in an individual being ineligible to receive bursary funding for future Tulo courses and cancellations fee as outlined below.

Course Completion Policy

A student who does not attend a course or receive a passing grade will be ineligible to receive bursary funding to attend Tulo for one year.

A student who does not attend a course or receive a passing grade for a second time will be ineligible to receive bursary funding to attend Tulo for three years.

Cancellation Policy

Due to high demand for the FNTC student Bursary program as well as limited spaces available in the Tulo courses, the FNTC adheres to a strict cancellation policy.

Cancellations fees will be charged to student employer First Nation as follows:

- Cancellations received 5 business days prior to the start of the course will result in a cancellation fee representing the full course tuition cost, the first night's accommodation cost and airline costs (if applicable).
